Event Report:

The NSS Unit of AISSMS's College of Engineering, Pune comprising of 18 members went to Tulapur village located about 32 km from Pune City.

The main motive of our visit was to give the brief information about "Swachh Bharat Abhiyan" & Govt. of Maharashtra schemes and also to spread the importance of cleanliness in the society as we are also a part of this society.

We reached at around 9:30 am in the village & had conversation with the Gram Panchayat officer Mrs. Jyotsna about the open drainage. The drainage water spread on the road and in front of the school premises so that it was very difficult to enter in the school. The dirty smell of drainage water finds very difficult to sit in the class. The AISSMS COE student observed it and decides to give the solution to this problem. They analysis the problem and prepared the plan and discussed with the grampanchayat member, Sarpanch and Gram Sevak as well as the head master of the school. They all gave some suggestion and we finally commenced the work of soak pits at 10:10 am.

We made a pit for the tank of sewage water in the primary school. A team of 4 students went to the class for teaching and briefing them about cleanliness and different education schemes for the students. They took the lecture and revision of the students. They also gave an idea about plastic pollution and how plastic waste affects the environment and encouraged them to minimize the use of plastic.

The remaining 14 volunteers started to work for making the soak pit as requested by the villagers. The volunteers started by marking the pit of size 4ft X 4ft and started digging the pit. The pit of 5 ft height was dug by the volunteers in about 4 hours. Then, a ready cement tank of size 4 x 3.5 ft. was lifted by the volunteers and set in the pit. The pit was then filled with rocks, stones, bricks and mud.

The volunteers thus completed this work within 8 hours work. The volunteers enjoyed a cup of tea after the work was completed and then everyone departed towards college with a feeling of satisfaction. The team had a great time with the villagers and students of the primary school in the village.

Pandharpur Wari is an annual pilgrimage Alandi to Pandharpur in Maharashtra in the month of July every year. Sant Dnyaneshwar and Tukaram are taken from their respective shrines to Pandharpur. This is 21 days March on foot from various locations in Maharashtra to Vithoba temple, Pandharpur, attracts a total of over a million pilgrims. Devotees from Maharashtra and nearby areas set out for Pandharpur,

As per the circular of Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune-07 about the Swachha Wari, Nirmal Wari, Nisarg Wari, the All India Shri Shivaji Memorial Society's , College Of Engineering, Pune-01, National Service Scheme unit has been participated in the Niramal wari Programmme on 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> July 2018 at Kasture Chowk , Nana Peth, Pune.

The volunteers reached the Ladkat School, Nana Peth, Pune on 8<sup>th</sup> July 2018 at 6.00am early in the morning. It was tea time early in the morning, so the the volunteers immediately helped to the local people for serving tea, biscuits and breakfast to the pilgrims of Dindi. Further the volunteers have been carried out the cleaning drive in Kasture Chowk and Kondhare wada area. The volunteers collected the plastic wrappers of Biscuits, empty glasses of tea and water and empty breakfast plates. While conducting the cleanliness drive volunteers also make awareness regarding the cleanliness. The volunteers appealed to the people that do not spit on road and public places. Then the volunteers took lunch. During the lunch break, Mrs. Manisha Kondhare, Corporator, PMC, visited the place and felicitated our NSS unit and appreciated their work and help. After everyone's lunch, volunteers removed the chairs and table and cleaned the area. In the evening volunteers again helped in serving the tea and biscuits and did some cleaning and traffic management up to 8.00 pm also dialogue with the pilgrims to know about their village and life.
